## From the Desk of Fr. Dan

The Men and Women's Christ Renews His Parish Retreats are quickly approaching. I would like to encourage every adult parishioner who has not done so to consider attending the retreats. Parishes are made strong faith communities by the way individual parishioners take time to deepen their own personal faith lives. Take some time to prayerfully consider attending the retreat, it is something good you can do for yourself and parish during Lent. The Men's retreat is March 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> and the Women's retreat is March 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>.

**Don't forget our wonderful Lenten Fish Fries** the Holy Spirit Men's Club hosts every Friday in the PLC. Great food and a super value!

**Ash Wednesday is February 14<sup>th</sup>, just a couple of weeks away.** I hope that all of you are planning on doing something special for Lent. The Lenten books will be available in the Gathering Space to help you on your spiritual journey. I remind you of the following: **Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of Fast and Abstinence and all Fridays during Lent are days of Abstinence.**

**Fast** – All adults are bound by the Law of Fast up to the beginning of their 60th year. (Canon 1252) “A person who has completed their 18th year of age is an adult.” (Canon 97, p.1) On days of Fast, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted; but liquids, including milk and fruit juices, are allowed.

**Abstinence** – “All persons who have completed their 14th year are bound by the Law of Abstinence.” (Canon 1252) On days of Abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note – When health or ability to work would be *seriously* affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning Fast or Abstinence, a parish priest or confessor should be consulted. In addition, other acts of penance are to be chosen by each person according to circumstances. These ideally will include increased prayer life, greater effort in the pursuit of virtue and the voluntary surrender of pleasures. “It is for the conference of Bishops to determine more precisely the observance of Fast and Abstinence and exercises of piety.” (Canon 1253) In response to this authorization the Bishops of the United States have described the seriousness of the obligation: “With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there is frequent question about the degree of seriousness of the matter.” The teaching of Pope Paul VI may be simply paraphrased: “The obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or ‘substantially’ the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious; rather it is the failure to observe any penitential days at all or a substantial number of such days which must be considered serious. People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and Abstinence on the days prescribed; works of religion and charity on the Fridays outside of Lent should be considered a minimal response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion of life.”

## Lent is Coming - Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults

On Ash Wednesday, February 14, the Catholic Church begins the Season of Lent. During this time the Church devotes itself to prayer, practices fasting, and increases its charitable giving (almsgiving). It is a time of preparation for the whole church to get ready to celebrate Easter, but most importantly it is a time for our catechumens to prepare for baptism.

Baptism is one of the most important steps in the lives of the catechumens, and the beginning of their life as Christians. Increasing prayer, fasting, and almsgiving is preparation for this new life they will receive during the Easter Vigil. It is Christ who calls them and the Church that joyfully joins in celebrating that call through Baptism.

The Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA) is a process for those interested in being baptized or joining the Catholic Church from another Christian tradition. 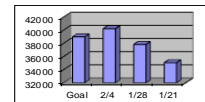
