The Resurrection is Real – Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults



Luke, the author of this week's gospel reading, was likely a physician. He was a man familiar with the human body and all of its functions. We can take Luke seriously when he writes about the resurrected body of Jesus in today's reading. He specifically notes that Christ's body held the wounds from the crucifixion and could be touched. Jesus is not a ghost! He has flesh and bones and he eats food to show he is not. Yet Christ's body is transformed and no longer subject to the laws to physics. For a doctor like Luke, this is proof that the Resurrection happened really, truly, and historically. Jesus physically died and he came back from that death never to die again.

Through Baptism, Christians are united to Christ's death and resurrection and are promised that we, too, will rise again from the dead in real, physical bodies when Jesus returns. By receiving the Eucharist God promises us that our bodies will share in his Resurrection and be free from death forever, too. We have this fullest and truest hope and we want everyone to share it with us.

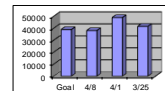
