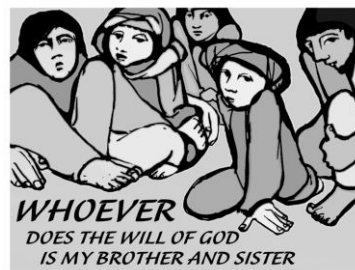

Along with that, we also experience evil that we did not create on our own – injustice, poverty, racism, sexism, corruption, and more. This is the reality of Sin that exists in our world. Something we personally have not created, but our actions can feed. It is a problem that needs fixing and we are incapable of fixing it on our own.

God takes on the problem of our sin and the Sin of the world, Catholics believe, by becoming a human being, Jesus of Nazareth, who speaks and lives the truth, resists sin, and overcomes Sin through his death and resurrection. Through the love of God poured out in the person of Jesus, we can resist sin and begin to change into the people we want to be.
