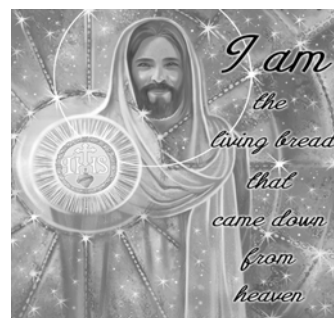

Dayspring Monthly Birthday Party

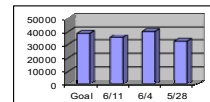
